



CASE 4 Learning Curriculum Field Tests

What is a Field Test?

The introduction of a new CASE 4 Learning course requires several steps. After course development, the curriculum is field-tested to check for appropriateness, accuracy, and flow.

In addition, field-testing a course provides an opportunity to validate the course and to inform the curriculum designers about potential areas of concern missed during the development stages.

Each field test comprises a group of teachers who agree to teach the course following the draft curriculum and provide feedback for necessary changes. Teachers and schools that agree to field-test a course are acknowledging their awareness of the *Field Test Conditions*.

Field Test Conditions

- The course is in draft format during the time of the field test. CASE 4 Learning staff has edited the curriculum under the review of a course development committee and sub-committee of lead teachers. Based on feedback from field test sites, CASE 4 Learning will revise the curriculum during the field test time. Teachers receive access to the final course materials upon publishing.
- 2. All participants provide feedback to support the final revision process. Feedback may include one or two virtual meetings throughout the school year.
- 3. All participating teachers must complete a CASE Field Test Institute for the new course before piloting the curriculum in their classrooms.
- 4. Teachers participating in a field test are listed in the *Acknowledgments* section of the final publication.
